

We couldn't have said it better! Our volunteers, chaplains, and staff helped to break generational cycles of crime and incarceration by providing purposeful programming

to the prison community so that incarcerated people return to their families and communities as transformed individuals.

We led programs on guitar, art, horticulture, financial literacy, Little Readers, mentoring, parenting, seminary, leadership, beekeeping, cooking, quilting, choir, creative writing, and provided **205 hours of free** trauma counseling sessions!

Spring Highlight

HeartBound hosted its ninth annual Returning Hearts Celebration at Walker State Prison. 28 men, 50+ children, and nearly 100 volunteers participated. We're expanding Returning Hearts in 2024 to two facilities in Georgia!

Autumn Highlight



At Songs in the Night, we heard from Governor Nathan Deal, as well as two of our former seminary students who are now free! Thanks to our incredible donors we raised over \$150,000 to support Christ-centered programming.
